#### What does it mean to be a Missionary Disciple?

Encounter - The purpose of evangelization is to lead people to encounter Christ. The Church which "goes forth" is a community of missionary disciples who take the first step, who are involved and supportive, who bear fruit and rejoice. An evangelising community knows that the Lord has taken the initiative, he has loved us first (cf. 1 Jn 4:19), and therefore we can move forward, boldly take the

initiative, go out to others, seek those who have fallen away, stand at the

To create a culture of encounter and witness, we must live explicit lives of discipleship. We are called not only to believe in the Gospel but to allow it to take deep root in us in a way that leaves us incapable of silence: we cannot help but to announce the Gospel in word and in deed. This missionary outreach is at the heart of discipleship. "Being a disciple means being constantly ready to bring the love of Jesus to others

#### Community - Evangelization invites people to the Body of Christ.

The Church is a community brought together by the work of the Holy Spirit: The Holy Spirit, sent by the Father and the Son, transforms our hearts and enables us to enter into the perfect communion of the blessed Trinity, where all things find their unity. He builds up the communion and harmony of the people of God. The same Spirit is that harmony, just as he is the bond of love between the Father and the Son. It is he who brings forth a rich variety of gifts, while at the same time creating a unity which is never uniformity but a multifaceted and inviting harmony. Evangelization joyfully acknowledges these varied treasures which the Holy Spirit pours out upon the Church.

#### Evangelization leads disciples to accept God's desire to send them out.

St. John Paul II in Redemptoris Missio stated that the first form of evangelisation is witness: "people today put more trust in witnesses than in teachers, in experience than in teachers, in experience than in teaching, and in life and action than in theories. The witness of a Christian life is the first and irreplaceable form of mission: Christ, whose mission we continue, is the 'witness' par excellence (Rv 1:5; 3:14) and the model of all Christian witness. The Holy Spirit accompanies the Church along her way and associates her with the witness he gives to Christ (cf. Jn 15:26-27)." As they get to know and love the Lord, disciples experience the need to share with others their joy by proclaiming Jesus Christ, not just with words, but also through service to those most in need. This is what it means to build the Kingdom of God and to be a missionary disciple.

#### Living as Missionary Disciples: A resource for Evangelisation - USCCB

TAKE MATHS SERIOUSLY - I ordered a 9-inch Pizza. After a while, the waiter brought two 5-inch pizzas and said, the 9-inch was not available and he was giving me two 5inch pizzas instead, and that I am getting 1-inch more for free!

I requested the waiter call the owner over. I gave him the mathematical formula to calculate the area of a circle: Circle Area =  $\pi$  r2 where  $\pi$  = 3.1415926, r is the radius of the circle. So, a 9-inch circle area = 63.62 sq.in. while a 5-inch circle area is 19.63 sq.in. The two 5-inch circle areas add up to 39.26 sq.in. I said that even if he gave three pizzas, I would still lose out. "How can you say you are giving an extra inch for free?" The owner was speechless. He finally gave me 4 pizzas. Take Maths Seriously!
