The work, "Angels Unaware," by the Canadian artist Timothy P. Schmalz, depicts 140 migrants and refugees from various historical periods traveling on a boat, and includes indigenous people, the Virgin Mary and Joseph, Jews fleeing Nazi Germany and those from wartorn countries.

Pope Francis said the statue had been inspired by a passage in "Letter to the Hebrews," from the New Testament: "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it."

Pope Francis said that it was "the poorest of the poor and the most disadvantaged who pay the price" of wars, injustice, economic and social imbalances, both local and global. He called on the Roman Catholic Church and the faithful to respond to the challenges of contemporary migration with four words.

"Welcome, protect, promote and integrate," he said, adding that the church's mission should also extend to "all those living in the existential peripheries."

Jesus immediately said to them:
"Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."

The Praises of Mary "Assumption"

Poem by Saint Anthony of Padua (1195-1231) Doctor of the Church

O how wondrous is the dignity of the glorious Virgin!
She merited to become the mother of Him who is the strength and beauty of the angels and the grandeur of all the saints.

Mary was the seat of our sanctification, that is to say, the dwelling place of the Son who sacrificed Himself for us.

"And I shall glorify the place where my feet have stood."

The feet of the Saviour signify His human nature.

The place where the feet of the Saviour stood was the Blessed Mary, who gave Him His human nature.

Today the Lord glorifies that place, since He has exalted Mary above the choirs of the angels.

That is to say, the Blessed Virgin, who was the dwelling of the Saviour, has been assumed bodily into heaven.



The Assumption - On November 1st, 1950, Pius XII defined the dogma of the Assumption. Thus he solemnly proclaimed that the belief whereby the Blessed Virgin Mary, at the close of her earthly life, was taken up, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, definitively forms part of the deposit of faith, received from the Apostles. To avoid all that is uncertain the Pope did not state either the manner or the circumstances of time and place in which the Assumption took place — only the fact of the Assumption of Mary, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, is the matter of the definition



Relics of Scottish Saints coming to Nottingham - Good Shepherd Catholic Church, Arnold, Nottingham, are expecting the relics of three saints to visit on Sunday 27th August. The relics of St Andrew the Apostle, St Margaret of Scotland and St Columba of Iona are visiting their parish as part of a national tour organised by the Knights of St Columba. Further details will be available soon.

Pope doubles down on message that church is open to all, including LGBTQ people and women - Pope Francis answered questions from journalists aboard his flight back to Rome from Lisbon, Portugal, Aug. 6, 2023, after his participation in World Youth Day. After driving home a message to young people for several days in a row that the church is open to everyone, Pope Francis on Aug. 6 reiterated that such a message includes LGBTQ people and all marginalized groups. "The Lord is clear," the pope said in reflecting on who is welcome in the church: "The sick, the elderly, the young, old, ugly, beautiful, good and bad." The pope continued to repeat the message that everyone is welcome in the Catholic Church — at one point getting young people to repeat after him "todos, todos, todos" ("everyone, everyone, everyone")

Pope to priests: I am on the journey with you - "I am close to you in your joys and sufferings, thank you for your often unrecognised service," Pope Francis writes in a letter to the priests of his Diocese, while warning them against spiritual worldliness that "hides behind appearances of religiosity and love for the Church, but in reality consists in seeking, instead of the glory of God, human glory and personal well-being.
