Solemnity of All Saints - Tuesday 1st November - The Story of the Solemnity of All Saints - The earliest certain observance of a feast in honor of all the saints is an early fourth-century commemoration of "all the martyrs." In the early seventh century, after successive waves of invaders plundered the catacombs, Pope Boniface IV gathered up some 28 wagonloads of bones and reinterred them beneath the Pantheon, a Roman temple dedicated to all the gods. The pope rededicated the shrine as a Christian church. According to Venerable Bede, the pope intended "that the memory of all the saints might in the future be honored in the place which had formerly been dedicated to the worship not of gods but of demons". The Story of the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed -Commemoration of All Souls - Wednesday 2nd - The Church has encouraged prayer for the dead from the earliest times as an act of Christian charity. "If we had no care for the dead," Augustine noted, "we would not be in the habit of praying for them." Yet pre-Christian rites for the deceased retained such a strong hold on the superstitious imagination that a liturgical commemoration was not observed until the early Middle Ages, when monastic communities began to mark an annual day of prayer for the departed members. In the middle of the 11th century, Saint Odilo, abbot of Cluny, France, decreed that all Cluniac monasteries offer special prayers and sing the Office for the Dead on November 2, the day after the feast of All Saints. The custom spread from Cluny and was finally adopted throughout the Roman Church. The theological underpinning of the feast is the acknowledgment of human frailty. Since few people achieve perfection in this life but, rather, go to the grave still scarred with traces of sinfulness, some period of purification seems necessary before a soul comes face-to-face with God. The Council of Trent affirmed this purgatory state and insisted that the prayers of the living can speed the process of purification. Mass at Matlock at 10:00am & Hassop at Noon


Mass Intentions - We have spaces in our diary for anyone who wishes to have a Mass offered for a loved one, living or deceased.

William Wordsworth - In November 1830, the famous English poet William Wordsworth travelled through Derbyshire. Wordsworth was not visiting as a tourist, taking only 3 days to pass through Derbyshire, starting at Chapel-en-le-frith and leaving by Swarkestone Bridge, south of Derby. During his journey Wordsworth travelled through Tideswell, Cressbrook and Ashford-in-the-Water before spending the night in Bakewell, perhaps in the Rutland Arms, on Bonfire Night. Wordsworth then visited Chatsworth before travelling on to Derby. Despite his short stay Wordsworth did write two poems about Chatsworth, one being written on the spot and the second being a revised and polished version of the first.
